Promote your Eden accommodation

We have recently reviewed our website accommodation section and for 2024 will be offering all Eden accommodation a FREE standard entry in the 'Where to Stay' section of our Visit Eden website.

A standard entry will include your business name, address, email address, telephone number and link to your website. Sections include Hotels, B&Bs and Guest Houses, Self-Catering, Camping and Touring, Glamping or Static Caravan and Lodges and Chalets.

In order to feature, we ask that accommodation operators have a valid inspection certificate.

There is also the opportunity to have an enhanced website entry (as we offer for the Attractions, Eateries and Conference sections). The cost is £81 (£97.20 total) for the remainder of 2024. For more information visit our website.

AA and VisitEngland assessment scheme modernisation

The current classification schemes have changed to a much simpler



format and structure to ensure quality assurance remains best in class.

This includes a brand new FREE entrylevel scheme called Visitor Ready.

There are now three primary levels of accreditation:

• A brand new entry-level scheme called Visitor Ready

This is free to join and it takes about 20 minutes to sign up.

(It is worth noting that we accept Visitor Ready as a method of accreditation to feature on our website).

Quality Assessed

This accreditation level involves a full assessment testing all services to ensure minimum quality standards are met, but with no star rating awarded.

• Quality Star Ratings from 3 to 5 Stars.

This involves an overnight assessment testing all services, resulting in a star rating (from 3 to 5) if the criteria are met.

Promoting Sustainable Transport



The Ullswater bus

Following the success of the 2023 pilot Ullswater Bus service, this year Stagecoach will be running an extended service including an extended season, increased number of services and destinations.

Operated by Stagecoach, the service will run until 3 November 2024.

The service is being provided as part of the drive for more sustainable transport and reduced private vehicle traffic in the Ullswater Valley; improving connections between where people are and where they wish to be within the valley.

The 509 service will operate between Keswick and Penrith visiting locations including Troutbeck, Dockray, Glenridding, Patterdale, Aira Force, Pooley Bridge, Askham and Lowther Castle.

Another service, UB1, will cover many of the holiday parks and other accommodation between Aira Force and Howtown. All buses are dog friendly, and all services are included in the Government's National bus Fare Cap Scheme meaning single fares are £2.

Single and return tickets are available as well as day tickets valid on any Stagecoach bus, not just the 509 and UB1. People can also buy a combined bus and boat ticket for a trip involving both Ullswater 'Steamers' and buses.

563 Stagecoach bus

The 563 Stagecoach bus service originally ran from Penrith to Appleby but will now also link to Kirkby Stephen, Sedbergh and Kendal between Monday to Friday.

On Saturday's, the service will continue to run between Penrith, Appleby and Kirkby Stephen.

The £2 cap on bus tickets continues until 31 December 2024

Visitors can continue to enjoy the reduced £2 single fare until the end of the year.

Arragons teams up with Avanti West Coast

Avanti West Coast has teamed up with a Cumbrian cycle business to make Penrith station



a designated pick-up point for bike hire.

The station, on the West Coast Main Line, will become a designated pick-up point for e-bike hire thanks to the partnership between the town's Arragons Cycles and Avanti.

The train operator has introduced the service with free delivery and collection for those arriving at the station.

Bookings can be made up to 24 hours in advance with Arragons Cycles.
